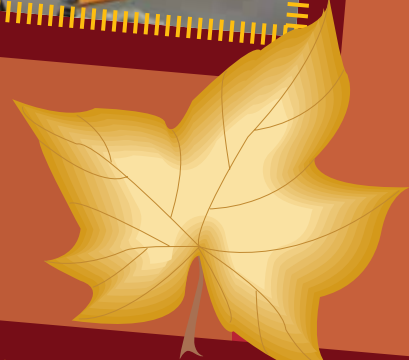

2011 Yard waste pickup - Ends the week of December 5-9 (on your regularly scheduled garbage pickup day)

Remember that yard waste in plastic bags IS NOT allowed and will not be picked up under any circumstance. Also, waste cans may not exceed 45 pounds or they will not be emptied.

Garbage pickup holiday schedules:

Labor Day, Sept. 5: will delay pickup of all Twp areas for the week by 1 day (pickups Tues thru Sat) | **Columbus Day, Oct 10:** will NOT delay anyone's pickup for the week

Thanksgiving Nov 24 & 25: will cause a 1 day pickup delay for Thursday & Friday areas only

Christmas & New Year holidays: will delay pickup of all Twp areas for the weeks of **December 26th & January 2nd** by 1 day each week (pickups will be Tues thru Sat)

To report problems with garbage, recycling or yard waste pickups please call Republic Waste's Customer Service Office directly at (877) 264-5544.

Large Item Pickups

Large Item Pickups (furniture, carpet, etc.) are done separate from the regular weekly household garbage pickup and currently are done only one day of the week which may not be your regular garbage day. Large item pickups require a separate fee to be prepaid prior to scheduling. For further info go to the Township's website at www.redfordtwp.com/pubservlarge.php or call 313-387-2690. Residents also have the option of taking items themselves to the two local landfills and paying the required dumping fees directly to the landfills. These landfills are Veolia 888-443-1717 in Northville and Sauk Trail Hills 734-397-2623 in Canton.

Water Bills

If your water bill account is delinquent and you are in danger of having your water disconnected for non-payment, call to see if you can work out an arrangement to avoid potential shutoff when we start the shutoff program every Spring/Summer. We also have suggestions on how to check and make sure you don't have undetected water leaks inside your toilet, etc. that may be increasing your water bills.

Water Discoloration

Water discoloration occurs when there is a main break or a hydrant is opened. Sediments in the lines are stirred up and require several hours to settle. Do not use your hot water until you are sure the water is clear, as this will draw the sediments into your hot water tank and may stain your laundry. Instead, periodically run a cold water faucet at the lowest point in your house (usually the basement) for 3-5 minutes until the cold water is running clear. If discoloration continues, please call the Water Department. **Remember this year the Fire Department will be flushing hydrants from September 12th thru October 31st which may discolor water.** More flushing details at www.redfordtwp.com.

Early Learning Communities: How It's Implemented & Used

Target Population: Parents and caregivers in low-income communities caring for children ages 0-5. The primary focus is on informal "family friend and neighbor" caregivers who account for two-thirds of subsidized care providers in Michigan. Home-based caregivers, center-based caregivers, and parents are also frequent participants.

Caring for young children is a tough job, whether you care for one child or a group of neighborhood children. Questions will come up and situations will arise in which you won't know how to respond. ELC is designed to be a resource for you—a place to get questions answered and to learn how to interact with children to maximize their potential.

Outreach: ELC hubs are trusted community organizations that use a variety of marketing and outreach techniques to reach caregivers and inform them of resources available. Techniques include flyers at frequented community institutions, mailings/calls to state subsidized caregivers, and door-to-door outreach. Word of mouth is among the most effective outreach methods, formalized through referral incentives for caregivers.

Getting Involved: To remove barriers to participation, ELC is designed to be delivered in trusted places (ELC sites are dedicated physical spaces in schools, community centers, and other familiar places), at convenient times, and in a way that is culturally sensitive to the surrounding community. Training is free, doesn't require long-term commitment and is open and welcoming to all caregivers. This is particularly important given the hesitancy of informal caregivers to participate in formal programs.

The initial motivation for getting involved at an ELC is typically not the training itself, but the "side perks" available to you as a caregiver. Free childcare during trainings gives you a much needed break from the children and allows you to socialize and network with other adults. The draw might be the rewards, such as gift cards or gas cards, earned by attending a certain number of trainings or the free snacks, both for the children and the adults. Regardless of the motivation, the first time you attend an ELC you encounter a friendly, welcoming staff that collects basic information and lets you know what resources are available to you and your children through the ELC.

Resources Available: 1) a 30-module, evidence-based training curriculum developed by High/Scope aimed at improving the knowledge and skills of parents and caregivers; 2) on-site high-quality childcare offered during training sessions; 3) lending libraries that give low-income parents and caregivers access to books and educational toys; 4) micro-coaching that links higher skilled caregivers with lower skilled caregivers in their community to provide 1:1 mentoring; and 5) access to literacy materials, providing children with an age-appropriate book mailed to their home every month until the age of five.

Upon arriving at an ELC on a typical visit, you drop your children off in the brightly colored childcare room to hear stories, do art projects, and have a nutritional snack. You head to the training room, where you socialize with other caregivers (there might be as many as 30 depending on the topic) for a few minutes before the training begins. The training is 1.5 hours of interactive instruction on any of the 30 topics, such as "Turning Conflicts into Learning" or "Backyard Science." You're in no rush to leave after the training. You stick around to socialize, ask a question that you weren't comfortable asking in front of the group, or head to the lending library to pick up a few books for the coming week. You might repeat this process once a month or twice a week. Between trainings, you might meet with a more experienced caregiver to get some help, attend a play group session with other caregivers and their children, or read your children the free book that comes to your home every month.

Results: To date, this platform has served as an entry point for over 4,800 caregivers, reaching an estimated 12,000 children. A four-year evaluation is measuring the effectiveness of the ELC. The first year of evaluation focused on caregiver utilization and perception of and the second year focused on measuring the relationship between the intervention and caregiver knowledge and practice. Future years will measure the effect of the ELC intervention on school readiness outcomes in affected children.

After participating in ELC activities for a while, you feel empowered and become part of a tight-knit community of caregivers. You start to attend more trainings and bring friends with you. You'll make sure you get over 40 hours of training so that you can participate in the annual recognition ceremony where you will be honored for your achievements, perhaps the first time in your life that you'll have such an experience. More importantly, you start to interact with your children differently. You yell less, aren't as frustrated, and have more positive interactions with your children on a daily basis. And you start to see it pay off, with the children becoming more talkative, more inquisitive and better behaved. You start to take more ownership over the ELC, serving as a mentor for other caregivers and getting more caregivers in your community to attend ELC events.

Reservations for both shelters and picnic areas must be made in person in the Leisure Services Office. Both rental fees and deposit must be paid at the time of sign up. **Rental fee can be paid by cash, check or charge and the deposit must be a separate check or money order.** Proof of residency or employment is required at the time of reservation. The person who applies for the permit is responsible for the site and shelter on the rental date.

In the event you decide not to use your picnic permit or shelter on your scheduled date, you must contact the Leisure Services Office at least 30 days prior to your scheduled rental date in order to receive a refund. Please note that a \$10 administration fee will be withheld on all refunds. No rain checks will be issued.



Important Rental and Picnic Information

- Picnic permits are required for any group of 20 or more persons.
- Inflatables or Bouncers are permitted only in designated areas. The renter is required to send the companies proof of insurance adding Redford Township no later than 2 weeks prior to the rental date.
- Grills are allowed in Township parks, however they may be no closer than 3 feet above the ground. Absolutely no table top or hibachis allowed. If you are using charcoal grills, all charcoal must be taken with you - do not leave coals in the park.
- Bathroom facilities located in Township parks are not left unlocked on weekends. Groups that rent picnic areas or pavillions can pick up a key no later than 4:30pm the day prior to their rental. Not all parks have bathroom facilities.
- All groups must abide by Redford Township Parks Rules and Regulations.

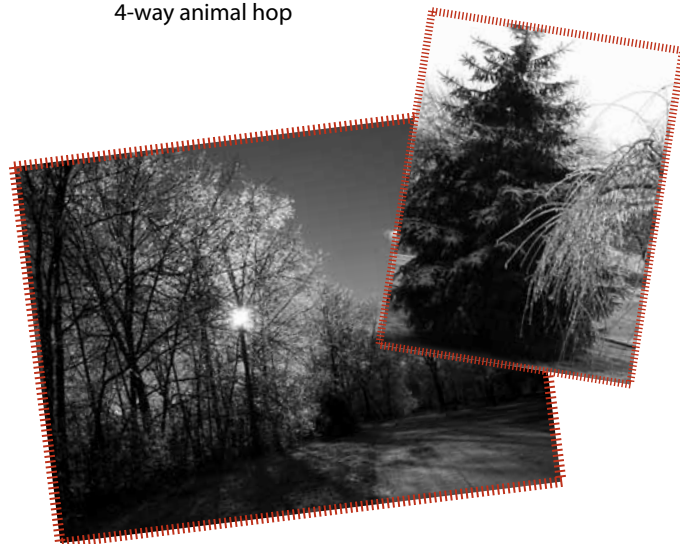
